#### 'Welcome Wales' Communities – The Afghan Resettlement Programme

Find out about this inspiring project, led by Taff Housing in Cardiff, which was one of last year's TPAS Cymru Good Practice Award winners.

The project came together at short notice to support the resettlement of Afghan refugees, who were airlifted from Kabul following the Taliban seizure of power in August 2021. Hear the latest update on the re-settling of families into the community, the good practice learnt, and the positive outcomes seen as a result of this truly remarkable project.

#### Outside Lives - a 'whole community' approach

Outside Lives, a community led social enterprise, actively brings together members of the community - connecting people through shared interests, activities and events that support personal wellbeing and growth, whilst also celebrating and protecting the natural world.

Hear from the inspiring founder of Outside Lives, Lucy Powell, who will share some casestudy examples showing how communities have been re-generated through co-production and by allowing the people to lead the process.


## SevernWye – making asset-based community development work
