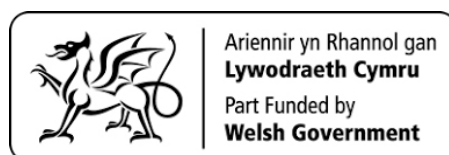

D3	<p>Valley Pantries – feeding families and saving food from landfill <i>Case studies session</i></p> <p>Valley Pantries is an award-winning community pantry scheme that covers the whole of the unitary authority area of Bridgend. It is a partnership between community interest company Baobab Bach, Linc, and more than 20 other partnership organisations, mainly community groups. Around 300 households are supplied with weekly bags of food, and so far, more than 100 tonnes of food have been diverted from landfill. 75 plus volunteers are involved in the scheme.</p> <p>In this workshop Linc's Alison Starling explains what's so special about the pantries and how the project can be replicated elsewhere.</p> <p>Speaker: Alison Starling, Linc Cymru</p>
