So what?

Rights – hard fought, hard won - easily scrapped

Homophobia is alive and well

 Isolation – and potential impact - socially, psychologically/health-wise



So why?

- You represent a wide range of people
- Important that everybody has the opportunity to participate
- Involving as many different people as possible will make any participation more meaningful
- Involving a diverse range of people gives better and more creative ideas



Getting it 'right' helps you to avoid...

Potentially poor decision-making

Only reflecting the needs of certain groups

A lack of/worsening community cohesion



LGBT+ issues in housing

Young people

 At risk of homelessness after 'coming out'



Family difficulties

Older people and sheltered accommodation



- Potential issues due to 'history'
- Need for services to be responsive
 & inclusive





So how?

- Be inclusive: language, images, assumptions they all matter
- Promote: be transparent and visibly demonstrate support
- Governance: is LGBT+ awareness part of your constitution or charter?
- Challenge: and the confidence to challenge



Top tips

- Training: raises awareness of equalities
- Data: what do you/your landlord know?
- Mystery shoppers: ask LGBT tenants for feedback on your landlord's websites/services and act on what they say
- Celebrate: think about attending a local Pride event or recognising a World Pride Day event
- Signpost: to relevant organisations/resources
